

VIETNAM TO CAMBODIA

CRUISE THE MEKONG RIVER FROM HO CHI MINH CITY TO SIEM REAP

Saturday 20 February to Friday 5 March 2027



Vietnam is a long, graceful country where limestone karsts rise from emerald bays, rice paddies ripple across river deltas, and motorbikes stream through cities that hum with life. Shaped by centuries of Chinese influence, French colonial rule, war, and resilience, it blends ancient pagodas and imperial citadels with colonial boulevards and glassy modern skylines. Daily life revolves around food and family: fragrant bowls of phở at dawn, street-side coffee thick with condensed milk, and markets alive with colour and chatter. From the cool mountains of the north to the tropical Mekong Delta in the south, Vietnam feels both deeply rooted in tradition and restlessly forward-looking, a place of warmth, intensity, and quiet beauty. Join us as we explore Vietnam and Cambodia by ship, cruising the Mekong from Ho Chi Minh City, Vietnam to Siem Reap, Cambodia, discovering life along this critical waterway. The tour is led by Owen Johnstone-Donnet and Takako Ishige of SJR.

ITINERARY

The itinerary for the tour, with key activities, is below. On some days additional activities are possible, some at no extra cost, others at additional cost. Meals included are shown as Breakfast (B), Lunch (L) and Dinner (D.) The tour is limited in size to 16 guests, with bookings confirmed on receipt of a deposit.

Saturday 20 February 2027 – Australia to Ho Chi Minh City (in flight meals)

Depart from Australia and fly direct to Ho Chi Minh City, or transit Hong Kong or another Asian city enroute to your destination. On arrival transfer to our hotel, and overnight Ho Chi Minh.

Sunday 21 February 2027 – Ho Chi Minh City (B/D)

Ho Chi Minh City is a fast-paced, sun-soaked metropolis where the energy of modern Vietnam collides with layers of history at every intersection. French colonial landmarks like Notre Dame Cathedral and the Central Post Office sit beside glass towers, while alleyways buzz with motorbikes, street food stalls, and the constant rhythm of daily life. Once known as Saigon, the city carries vivid memories of war in its museums, yet feels unmistakably future-focused, entrepreneurial, and young. From rooftop bars overlooking the Saigon River to plastic stools serving late-night bowls of hủ tiếu, Ho Chi Minh City is loud, warm, chaotic, and irresistibly alive. Today is an opportunity to relax and explore at leisure, before we meet our Scenic Tour Director and fellow guests at a welcome dinner. Overnight Ho Chi Minh City.

Monday 22 February 2027 – Ho Chi Minh City (B/L/D)

After breakfast, travel to the Cu Chi Tunnels and spend the morning learning about the development and establishment of this hidden covered tunnel network that the Viet Cong soldiers hid in for months on end. Return to the city for a Pho lunch with the remainder of the afternoon at leisure. Tonight, choose your dining venue - and experience - from a range of options: from an exhilarating Vespa ride at night as your experienced driver winds in and out the hectic traffic of the streets, stopping at all the best local spots for the most scrumptious Vietnamese cuisines, where you can sample the best authentic street food and an unlimited supply of drinks and eating however much your stomach desires. Alternatively, dine at Mandarine Restaurant, designed in the style of the Hue imperial court serving individual Vietnamese dishes. Or for something totally different dine at Noir Dining in the Dark, a restaurant dedicated to helping the blind and visually impaired community. Other choices include experiencing the street food and bars of Saigon on a Vintage Jeep or enjoying the offerings at Buffet 19 at your hotel. Overnight Ho Chi Minh City.



Tuesday 23 February 2027 – Ho Chi Minh City sightseeing, and then to Scenic Spirit for our cruise (B/L/D)

After breakfast and checkout, visit the War Museum and Reunification Palace. The former Presidential House of South Vietnam became famous in 1975 with images of tanks crashing through its gates leading to the South's surrender and end of the War of Independence. After lunch, a coach will transfer you to My Tho where the breathtaking Scenic Spirit awaits. Start with a cocktail reception then take a stroll around the decks to orientate yourself. After our welcome dinner, settling into your private suite - at any time, your dedicated personal butler is free to swing by with a nightcap and delivery of your preferred pillows. A calm four hour sail brings us to halt off Cai Be where the ship will anchor overnight.

Wednesday 24 February 2027 (B/L/D) – Cai Be to Sa Dec

Start the day with a full gourmet breakfast – complete with champagne – before heading out to explore Cai Be. Choose to travel via sampan to Tan Phong, a small island located near Cai Be town that is rich in alluvial soil suitable for tropical fruit orchards all year round. With a total area of more than 1,000 hectares, surrounded by silted sandbanks, canals and a mild temperature, Tan Phong has long been a friendly destination for eco-tourism. On arrival, try a hands-on experience at a workshop specialised in weaving water hyacinth into artistic crafts. Board a motorised buggy for a ride through endless fruit orchards, stopping to enjoy the tropical fruits and interact with a farm owner. Reboard the sampan and cruise to Cái Bè town to discover the local cottage industry where families make rice-paper and sweets from pop-corn, pop-rice and coconut. Alternatively take a sampan from the Scenic Spirit to savour a delicious afternoon tea at the Le Longanier, a French colonial house restaurant, where staff will welcome you with tea, coffee and a range of local fruit and snacks for your tasting. You can dive into a local experience with a band playing music and performing traditional Vietnamese songs. After your morning activity, head back to the ship for lunch whilst sailing to Sa Dec. Upon arrival in Sa Dec, board your sampan once again to explore the lively wet market where you can meet the sellers and marvel at their wares, including live fish, frogs and even snakes. This two-hour exploration will take you deep into the local lifestyle. You can also see the grand home of Mr. Huynh Thuy Le, a Chinese merchant who inspired Marguerite Duras' novel L'Amant. After returning to the ship, enjoy an evening dip in the pool overlooking the Mekong as the sun sets. Experience a fantastically themed dinner on board with a lion dance performed by locals on the expansive Sundeck. The ship will set sail after your arrival back on board for the six hour journey to Tan Chau.



Thursday 25 February 2027 (B/L/D) – Tan Chau to the Cambodian Border Crossing

After breakfast, leave city life behind at Tra Su Bird Sanctuary in Tra Su Forest. Travel by sampan through endless tranquil waterways, flanked by mangroves and lush greenery. This eco reserve spans 850 hectares and is an ecological haven for fauna and flora, home to more than 100 species of waterbirds. Alternatively, experience a traditional way of life on Evergreen Island, joining local farmers for a morning of discovery. Back in Tan Chau, ride in a xe loi, a three-wheeled bicycle rickshaw that was introduced by the French in the 19th century and is a common form of transportation in rural Vietnam.

Visit the recently renovated, brightly coloured Cao Dai temple. Caodaism is a new religion, established in 1926 in the southern Vietnamese city of Tây Ninh, and brings together beliefs and practices from Buddhism, Christianity, Taoism and Confucianism. Here, you will learn more about the mix of ideas that form the basis of this new religion. If you prefer, board a speedboat to visit Chau Doc, a major city in the Me kong Delta, and Tay An temple. Set at the foot of Sam Mountain, this elaborate temple is a mixture of Indian and Islamic architecture. Afterwards, board another sampan to visit Vinh Te canal and view life along the riverfront of Chau Doc, before making your way back to Scenic Spirit. Back on board, enjoy lunch as we sail to the Vietnamese and Cambodian border. After the ship clears immigration into Cambodia at the border, enjoy dinner in one of the restaurants, and then settle in for an overnight sail towards Phnom Penh, bidding farewell to Vietnam.



Friday 26 February 2027 (B/L/D) – Phnom Penh

Arrive in the capital of Phnom Penh early this morning, and after breakfast, head out and explore the city. You can choose to journey to the infamous Killing Fields and take a tour of the Tuol Sleng Genocide Museum, housed inside a former prison. These sites are a sobering reminder of the terrors unleashed by the Khmer Rouge regime in the 1970s. This moving tour will give you a deeper insight into the tumultuous history of Cambodia and the resilience of its people. Passionate foodies may like to choose a hands-on cooking class. Take a trip to the bustling market with a local chef to purchase your ingredients, then head back to the kitchen to cook your own lunch, testing out the styles and flavours of Cambodian cuisine. Alternatively, travel by remork, a local style of tuk tuk, to explore the French architecture, backstreets and history of Phnom Penh. Finish the tour with shopping at the Central Market, famed for its unique Art Deco design and bright yellow façade. At the conclusion of the tour, return to Scenic Spirit for lunch, with the remainder of the afternoon is at leisure. Later this evening, revel in our Phnom Penh by City Lights tour. You'll get to witness the nightlife of the capital before stopping at a local rum distillery for exclusive Sunset Drinks experience, including a private tour and tasting.



Saturday 27 February 2027 (B/L/D) – Phnom Penh to Oudong

This morning travel by bus for the short drive to the ancient capital of Cambodia, Oudong. Experience the life of the monks and nuns who reside at the monastery, and if fortunate, view one of the many festivals and traditional rituals often held. Return to the city, discover the opulence of Phnom Penh's Royal Palace and the famous Silver Pagoda within. Set on the riverfront, this dazzling palace was built in the 1860s and still serves as the official residence of the King of Cambodia. Return to the ship and before setting sail, enjoy a cultural performance by the Cambodian Student and Children's Organisation. Enjoy an evening cocktail reception on the sundeck against the backdrop of Phnom Penh's lights and stunning scenery as the ship sets sail towards Oknha Tey, commonly known as Silk Island.



Sunday 28 February 2027 (B/L/D) – Silk Island to Angkor Ban

This morning explore the island of Oknha Tey, dedicated to the art of silk weaving. Travel by traditional tuk tuk to the farm, meet the workers and learn about silk production. Return to the ship for lunch and some free time. After lunch, call at Angkor Ban, a small settlement where time stands still. Explore its historic wooden houses, which date back over 100 years and survived the destruction of the Khmer Rouge. Back on board, learn the many ways to wear a krama, the traditional Cambodian scarf, as the ship sails towards Kampong Cham.



Monday 1 March 2027 (B/L/D) – Wat Hanchey to Kampong Cham

Meet the novice monks at Wat Hanchey, an ancient hilltop pagoda and monastery. Walk (or drive) to the top and soak in some of the best elevated views of the cruise. Receive a traditional blessing from a monk and learn how to pray in a Buddhist pagoda before partaking in an alms ceremony, which contributes to the daily meal of the resident monks. We then sail back to Kampong Cham. This afternoon, explore Kampong Cham and its surrounds. Choose to learn about local folklore at Phnom Pros, a mountaintop pagoda that has long been part of a traditional legend. Tragically, in more modern times, the site was used as a Killing Field by the Khmer Rouge. The temple now features a Buddha Garden and is home to a local troop of monkeys. Afterwards, visit Wat Nokor Bachey, a unique architectural experiment that blends an Angkorian era temple with a new temple built inside it. Alternatively, explore Kampong Cham's history and industry with a drive past shop houses, remnants of the French colonial era, and the large Central market. Visit a local rubber plantation established by the French before stopping at a village known for growing betel nut, an important part of Cambodian culture. Your third option today is a visit to Kho Penh Village. Located on Pen (Bamboo) Island, it's only accessible by local remork after crossing by bamboo bridge or ferry from Kampong Cham. This remote village gives you a fascinating insight into the simple, rural lifestyle of farmers in Cambodia. Back on board you will have time to relax and overlook the gorgeous sunset of the Cambodian skyline before your engaging farewell dinner with the crew.



Tuesday 2 March 2027 (B/L) – cruising the Mekong to Siem Reap

Today we journey to Siem Reap via stops at Kampong Tom and the Angkorian bridge in Kampong Kdei. Siem Reap is a split in time with ancient and traditional architecture weaved between the modern developments. Step back in time at your hotel, a definition of luxury and your historical home for the next three nights in Siem Reap. This brilliantly appointed accommodation is styled with a mix of French inspired architecture, local interior furnishings, with the attentive staff providing a service beyond expectations, and with brilliant amenities. This evening head to the colourful Cambodian Phare Circus where your VIP premium reserved seating awaits you. Beautifully dressed performers style a stunning show that is more than just a circus. The performers use theatre, music, dance and modern circus arts to tell uniquely Cambodian stories; historical, folk and modern. Overnight in our hotel, Siem Reap.



Wednesday 3 March 2027 (B/L) – Siem Reap and Angkor Wat

The second day of your Siem Reap exploration starts with a delicious champagne buffet breakfast at the hotel. Today you have multiple options to choose from for exploration. Visit the 10th-century Banteay Srei Temple, a temple commonly referred to as the Ladies Temple because of its pinkish sandstone and dedication to the Hindu god Shiva. Afterwards visit the Landmine Museum, founded in 1997 with the aim to make the country safe through the removal of mines. Other options include a visit Senteurs d'Angkor workshop to try your hand at producing your own local souvenir. Through different hands-on workstations, discover how the artisans make by hand soap with coconut oil, natural cosmetics, subtly scented balms, aromatic candles and local spices in traditional ways or undertake a village walk through Ta Brak Village. Alternatively, if you have enjoyed being on the water, sail on Tonle Sap, a picturesque UNESCO biosphere reserve and experiencing the life of a floating village or visit the Angkor Wildlife Aquarium and learn about the Mekong eco system with a special behind-the-scenes tour where you can see animal care in action, participate in feeding sessions, and even meet some park stars up close. Or take flight in a tethered balloon to discover the aerial beauties of the combination between traditional and modern Siem Reap. Enjoy the fresh air and take some remarkable photographs of the skyline as you lift into the skies of Siem Reap overlooking Angkor Wat below before visiting a Lotus Flower workshop.



Later this afternoon explore Angkor Wat itself, the largest religious monument in the world. Originally constructed as a Hindu temple dedicated to the god Vishnu for the Khmer Empire, it was gradually transformed into a Buddhist temple towards the end of the 12th century. An afternoon visit provides the perfect light for those idealic pictures of this colossal structure. After the day of adventure, tonight is free to shop away at the night markets of Siem Reap or venture to Pub Street, both in walking distance or a short tuk tuk ride from your hotel. Overnight in our hotel, Siem Reap

Thursday 4 March 2027 (B/D) – Siem Reap

Begin the day with an early morning experience, marvel at the sunrise over the magnificent Angkor Wat before moving to a special location near a temple for a scrumptious champagne breakfast with food prepared by an NGO supported local bakery school. After breakfast, visit the atmospheric, jungle covered Ta Prohm Temple, before stopping at Angkor Thom and the multi-faced Bayon Temple. You have the remainder of the afternoon to discover more of the Siem Reap markets or relax at your hotel after your early morning start. Our final experience is a private magical gala themed dinner at Prasat Kravan, a small 10th-century temple consisting of five reddish brick towers on a common terrace. Including drinks and a show featuring Apsara dancers in front of the candle lit temple ruins, this evening brings to the end what we hope will have been an incredible and remarkable trip. Overnight in our hotel, Siem Reap



Friday 5 March 2027 (B) – depart Siem Reap for Australia or Ho Chi Minh City



The tour is limited in size, with a maximum of 16 participants, with bookings confirmed in order of receipt of a deposit of \$3,000 per person. **The tour fare is from 14,495* per person (twin share) plus airfares from Australia**, and includes a **Deluxe Suite on Scenic Spirit. Sole use of hotel rooms and sole use of a Deluxe Suite on the cruise is available at a supplement from \$10,980 pp.** The tour fare includes all hotels and sightseeing, cruise and coach travel as indicated; all accommodation on a double/twin share basis (single accommodation is available on payment of the single supplement); sightseeing and entrance fees to sites as indicated, and meals as shown in the itinerary for each day. The fare does not include meals not identified, drinks, excess baggage charges, telephone calls, laundry, any items of a personal nature, travel outside the organised group. Due to the variety of interests of individuals, and the range of sites, museums etc. available for inspection on some days, we have included key features in the tour cost. Inspection and entry fees when not part of the planned group activity are not included in the tour cost. (**Note** – as cruise fares are priced dynamically, and subject to availability on the Scenic Spirit, they can change until payment is made and your Deluxe Suite is confirmed.)
