A NEW ZEALAND RAIL JOURNEY

Forgotten World Rail Adventure

Drive your rail cart along 142 km of railway - 98 bridges and 24 tunnels, and Auckland to Wellington rail journeys

Tuesday 19 November – Saturday 30 November 2024 (optional extension to Christchurch, South Island, to Wednesday 4 December 2024)

Join us to New Zealand's North Island to experience a unique rail adventure – driving your own rail cart along the 142 km rail line from Okahukura to Stratford and return. We pass through 24 tunnels, and cross 98 bridges on this remarkable journey, experiencing local hospitality and the beautiful New Zealand countryside along the way. Explore the Taranaki Region of New Zealand – Mt Taranaki and New Plymouth - as well as journeying on the paddle steamer Waimarie on the Wanganui River. Experience the Northern Explorer rail journey from Auckland to Wellington, and there is the option to continue to the South Island aboard the Interislander ferry, and journey on New Zealand's Coastal Pacific and spectacular TranzAlpine rail journeys, as well as Christchurch's restaurant tram, as part of a five day/four night extension.



ITINERARY

The itinerary for the tour, with an overview of activities, is below. Meals included are shown as Breakfast (B), Morning Tea (MT), Lunch (L), Afternoon Tea (AT), Light Dinner (LD) and Dinner (D).

Tuesday 19 November 2024 – to Auckland

A mid morning departure from Australia on a flight to Auckland, for a mid afternoon arrival. The recommended group flight from Sydney will be met in Auckland, and transfer arranged to our city hotel, where you can enjoy a walk along the foreshore of Auckland Harbour, before a meal at leisure at one of the many restaurants on the harbour foreshore, in front of our hotel. Overnight Auckland.

Wednesday 20 November 2024 (B/D) – Auckland sightseeing

Enjoy a day of sightseeing in and around Auckland, with options to cruise on the Hauraki Gulf and explore Waiheke Island. Some free time before joining us for dinner in the Sky Tower's excellent revolving restaurant – enjoy views at evening light overlooking the city and harbour. Overnight Auckland.

Thursday 21 November 2024 (B/L/D) – Auckland to Taumarunui on the Northern Explorer

After an early breakfast, we depart Auckland on KiwiRail's Northern Explorer service south to Taumarunui. Experience the North Island's lovely range of scenery as the Northern Explorer takes you through rolling green farmland, virgin bush and past quaint country towns. On arrival at Taumarunui we transfer to our motel and leave luggage. We visit the Nevalea Alpaca Farm – the largest in New Zealand – and as well as learning all about the animals and the farm, we enjoy luncheon in this picturesque location. This evening we enjoy a freshly prepared country-style dinner in our motel, before a good rest prior to beginning our rail adventure tomorrow. Overnight Taumarunui.

Friday 22 November 2024 (B/MT/L/AT/D) – rail carts - Okahukura to Whangamomona

After a hearty breakfast we travel the short distance to Okahukura by mini bus where our adventure begins. Board our rail carts (designed for two and with some for four) and we begin our 142km journey through 24 tunnels, and across 98 bridges on our way to Stratford. See the remnants of the original settlements along the line - the history of this landscape will resonate as you absorb the stories and relive the memories of New Zealand's pioneering past with this two-day journey back in time to Stratford. With morning and afternoon tea stops enroute, where we see local communities, we arrive at our destination for the first night, Whangamomona. Dinner and overnight accommodation is in the Whangamomona Hotel. (Most rooms at the Whangamomona hotel are not ensuite – rooms share bathrooms in this regional NZ outpost.)

Saturday 23 November 2024 (B/MT/L/D) – rail carts – Whangamomona to Stratford

After breakfast we rejoin our rail carts and begin our second day as we drive our carts towards Stratford. Through Pohokura and Te Wera, Douglas and Toko to Stratford. Morning tea, sightseeing and luncheon stops are included, and on arrival at Stratford we transfer to our excellent accommodation for three nights. Set in the foothills of Mt Taranaki, Stratford provides an excellent base to explore. Dinner is included in this small but vibrant town, and overnight Stratford.

Sunday 24 November 2024 (B) – Mt Taranaki, New Plymouth sightseeing

Today we explore the Taranaki Region – begin with breakfast on the slopes of Taranaki, and then time for a short walk to view the mountain that gives its name to the national park. From the impressive picture-perfect Mount Taranaki that towers 2518m over the region, we head via Opunake with its famous black sand beach to New Plymouth. Boasting the impressive Len Lye Centre for contemporary art, Puke Ariki Museum promoting the heritage of the Taranaki people, and the architectural masterpiece that is the Te Rewa Rewa bridge. Boasting rich volcanic soils, the local botanic gardens are also impressive, and we return to Stratford. Enjoy dinner at leisure. Overnight Stratford.

Monday 25 November 2024 (B) – Whanganui paddle steamer and vintage tram

This morning we visit Whanganui to experience both a restored vintage tram in operation, and also to experience a cruise on the beautiful historic paddle steamer Waimarie that operates from Whanganui. Enjoy a simple luncheon purchased aboard. The picturesque river city of Whanganui has an interesting history. During the late 1800s the city was an important trading centre, with the Whanganui River serving as a key transportation route for goods and people. The city's rapid expansion during this period has left its mark on the city's architecture. Notable buildings include the Royal Whanganui Opera House and the Sarjeant Art Gallery. We return to Stratford for dinner at leisure and overnight Stratford.



Tuesday 26 November 2024 (B/MT/L/D) - rail carts - Stratford to Whangamomona

After breakfast we rejoin our rail carts and begin our third day back behind the wheel as we drive our carts towards Whangamomona. Morning and afternoon tea, as well as luncheon stops are included as we traverse this forgotten world of the railway line piercing through the hills and valleys of the North Island. On arrival at Whangamomona we walk to our accommodation for the night. Whangamomona is New Zealand's answer to Western Australia's Hutt River Province, and prides itself on being a self proclaimed republic. Dinner and overnight Whangamomona.

Wednesday 27 November 2024 (B/MT/L/AT/D) – rail carts to Okahukura and Taumarunui

Our final day on the rail carts as we return towards Okahukura. At the end of our journeying we will have travelled through 48 tunnels, and crossed 196 bridges – a unique experience few will have the privilege of taking. A perspective of being at rail level as we cross the countryside of the north island of New Zealand. At Okahukura we join our coach and return to Taumarunui - enjoy a simple country style dinner and overnight Taumarunui.

Thursday 28 November 2024 (B/MT) – Northern Explorer to Wellington

After breakfast we visit Laurens Lavender Farm - a family owned business growing around 8,000 lavender plants. Late morning we return to Taumarunui Railway Station to join the Northern Explorer south to Wellington. The journey through Tongariro National Park, with its three spectacular volcanic mountains – Tongariro, Ngāuruhoe and Ruapehu – is a highlight, a place of extremes and surprises, where snow-blanketed fields, ancient lava flows and dense beech forests can be seen side by side. Equally we journey around the Raurimu Spiral - a single-track railway spiral, starting with a horseshoe curve, overcoming a 139-metre height difference on the North Island Main Trunk Railway is a notable feat of civil engineering, having been called an "engineering masterpiece." An early evening arrival into Wellington – we transfer to our hotel and the evening is free to enjoy a meal at one of the many nearby cafes and restaurants on Wellington's harbour shores. Dinner at leisure and overnight Wellington.

Friday 29 November 2024 (B/D) – Wellington sightseeing

After breakfast we board Wellington's Cable Car for the scenic ride from Lambton Quay through the hillside terraced houses of Kelburn to the lookout perched high above the city. Inspect the Cable Car Museum, before a pleasant walk down through the Botanic Gardens. With 25 hectares of specialised plant collections, colourful botanical displays, unique landscape, protected native forest, and views over Wellington City, our walk ends at the Rose Garden and Glasshouses. Enjoy a well deserved morning refreshment at their tea house before we depart for a scenic drive around the extensive coastline of the city. In the later afternoon you can choose to enjoy some time in the acclaimed Te Papa 'Museum of New Zealand' with its huge Maori collection, amongst other world-class exhibits. Tonight enjoy a farewell dinner for those leaving us to return to Australia, or join for a welcome dinner with those joining us for the continuation of the tour to New Zealand's South Island. Overnight Wellington.

Saturday 30 November 2024 (B/L) – to Australia or New Zealand's South Island

Those returning to Australia have a relaxing morning before a mid afternoon transfer to Wellington Airport for flights back to Australia. Alternatively join us on the midday crossing aboard the Interislander Ferry to Picton on New Zealand's South Island. After the scenic crossing of the Cook Straight, we enter Queen Charlotte and Marlborough Sounds to the port of Picton. Enjoy luncheon aboard, before a mid afternoon arrival. Check in to our Picton accommodation for the night and dinner is at leisure.

Sunday 1 December 2024 (B/L) – to Australia or New Zealand's South Island

A relaxing morning to explore the sites of Picton, before we board the Coastal Pacific for the scenic rail journey along the eastern coastline from Picton through Kaikoura to Christchurch. We enjoy the rail travel with **New Zealand's new Scenic Plus Dining service**, with food and drink included and served at your seat, as well as a private observation car to enjoy the journey. The line passes the vineyards of Blenheim, hugs the coastline for much of the journey south, and then crosses the Canterbury Plains to Christchurch. On arrival we transfer to our hotel, dinner is at leisure, and overnight Christchurch.

Monday 2 December 2024 (B/D) – Christchurch



Enjoy a leisurely day of sightseeing in this fine English city – as it rebuilds from the earthquake that damaged much of the city centre – evidence that is still very clear. With punts gliding along the Avon River, a temporary Anglican Cathedral and even trams! Internationally famed as 'The Garden City', Christchurch's well-established expansive parks and public gardens owe much to the planning and foresight of the city's founding fathers.

The centrally-located 161 hectare Hagley Park, the Botanic Gardens, the four leafy inner-city avenues, Victoria Square and spectacular gardens such as Mona Vale on the banks of the River Avon bear testimony to this legacy. Visit the Christchurch Art Gallery and Museum and other cultural sights, and explore walking in this very attractive city. Dinner tonight is aboard the Christchurch Tramway Restaurant Car – the only one in New Zealand - travel the tram lines of the city and enjoy dinner. Overnight Christchurch.

Tuesday 3 December 2024 (B/L/D) – Christchurch to Greymouth return – the TranzAlpine

Today we join what has been described as one of the world's great rail journeys – the TranzAlpine Express - that traverses the Southern Alps between Christchurch and Greymouth. The trip is 223.8 kilometres long and takes four and a half hours. There are 16 tunnels, and 5 viaducts, the highest being the 'Staircase' standing at 73 metres. Leaving Christchurch we travel across the fields of the Canterbury Plains with its rich farmland, before ascending into the Southern Alps, with spectacular gorges and river valleys of the Waimakariri River. From Arthurs Pass we descend steeply to the lush beech rain forest of the West Coast and to Greymouth. A small historic gold mining community, where the precious metal is still mined today. We travel in **New Zealand's new Scenic Plus Dining service class**, with all meals and drinks included in the experience. Greymouth is now a service centre for the west coast, and a jumping off point for the scenic south west of the island. We return in the afternoon to Christchurch, retracing our steps but with a different perspective as we view the scenery approaching from the opposite way. Again experience the all inclusive meal and drink service aboard the Scenic Pus carriages, with private observation carriage. Overnight Christchurch.

Wednesday 4 December 2024 (B) - the International Antarctic Centre and to Australia

After a relaxed breakfast we check out of the hotel late-morning and head to the International Antarctic Centre near Christchurch's International Airport. Established in 1992 the centre presents an incredible world of ice and mystery, ambition and endeavour. Experience snow and ice, survive an indoor Antarctic storm, learn about life at Scott Base and see what it takes to work on the ice. Watch Little Blue Penguins, snuggle in with huskies, experience an Hägglund ride, an awesome 4D theatre, a massive HD screen and more. Enjoy luncheon and in the early afternoon walk to the nearby Christchurch International Airport for your flight back to Australia. There are direct Christchurch flights to Australia's eastern seaboard capitals, or you may prefer to transit Auckland for a return to Australia.

ACCOMMODATION AND MEALS

Accommodation in Auckland, Wellington and Christchurch is in 4½ - 5 star hotels, and in regional New Zealand in 3½ - 4 star hotels. Some accommodation in Whangamomona involves shared bathroom facilities. Breakfast is included most mornings, with lunches and dinners as identified in the itinerary. Where there is a range of lunch and dinner options, we have not included these in the itinerary to provide choice in style and time of dining.

CAPACITY TO PARTICIPATE IN THE TOUR

Fitness and mobility is necessary for participation in the tour. Tour passengers must be able to manage their own luggage, and to carry/wheel it on and off trains, from stations and coaches to hotels, and if necessary, up or down a flight of stairs. The tour involves travelling on golf carts on rail tracks, and the ability to move safely on unformed and uneven surfaces, such as rail tracks, is essential. There is also exploration of locations by walking. By payment of your deposit and tour fare you confirm that you are of a suitable level of mobility and fitness to participate in the tour, and are aware of the nature of the tour.

The tour is limited in size to 2 guests - bookings will be confirmed in order of receipt of a deposit of \$2,000 per person.


